Tacitus 36-170 A.D.	A.D. 850	800 years after he wrote	33
Roman Historian who wrote about 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> century Rome. Wrote about Nero blaming the Christians for a fire that damaged Rome.			
New Testament Various Authors.	A.D. 100-150	Decades later	5,700+ Greek Manuscripts
